- The G20 Interfaith Forum aims to inform political leaders, human rights commissions and civil societies at the G20 about the contributions religious organizations can make to the G20's objectives.
- The G20 (or Group of Twenty) is an international forum for the governments and central bank governors from 19 countries and the European Union. It seeks to address global issues that go beyond the responsibilities of any one nation.
- Beginning in <u>Australia in 2014</u>, the G20 Interfaith Forum has convened annually in the G20 host country. It met in <u>Turkey in 2015</u>, <u>China in 2016</u>, <u>Germany in 2017</u>, and <u>Argentina in 2018</u>.
