



Terms and Conditions

For Participating in G20 Interfaith Forum Events

The G20 Interfaith Forum (IF20) regularly organizes events for discussion of a variety of issues relevant to policy formation at the G20 level. These are often co-organized with other partners, who may have additional terms and conditions of their own (the “Co-Organizers”). The G20 Interfaith Forum offers an annual platform and a variety of subsidiary events where networks of religiously linked and faith-inspired actors engage on global agendas, within the broad framework of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and successive G20 host countries’ agendas. The G20 Interfaith Forum is part of an ongoing process that draws on contributions made by participants to share ideas with G20 leaders and with other participants in the G20 process.

Among other things, these terms and conditions are intended to facilitate and assure compliance with the European Data Protection Regulation and other similar data protection provisions in different jurisdictions (referred to collectively as “GDPR”) that may apply.

Registration and processing of data

By registering for the Events, the registrant accepts that his or her data can be processed by the Co-Organisers for the purposes described in these Terms and Conditions.

During registration the registrant is asked to share:

- a) Identification data and other personal data (including first name, last name, gender, nationality, country of residence, e-mail, social media details, academic/professional title, position, organisation name and type), as well as birthdate and passport information that may be needed to facilitate travel arrangements. Opportunity is also provided to indicate dietary requirements and other special needs. Not all information is required, although it helps the Co-Organisers to create a network of religious-linked and faith-inspired actors to engage in global agendas. The mandatory identification data is needed for logistical and organisational purposes (for example, the email is needed for confirmation of the registration as well as a means of contact throughout the Events and follow-up). The non-mandatory other personal data will be used to facilitate the registrant’s engagement with the Events and the G20 Interfaith Forum process, for historical archiving and for anonymized statistical purposes.
- b) Religious information (including religious affiliation and religious title when applicable). As a religious aggregatory event it is in the interest of the Co-Organisers to collect information on religious information from the registrants. If requested, this information is never mandatory, and if provided will only be processed to help assure maximum inclusion and non-discrimination, and for anonymized statistical purposes. There will be no other disclosure of registrants’ religious information. Regarding this special category of data, the data subject is required to give specific consent according to article 9 (2) (a) of the GDPR. In the event such religious data is submitted,

the data subject will be deemed to consent to this data being collected if and when he or she submits such data.

By registering for the Events, the registrant grants permission to the Co-Organisers to record, publish, share, or otherwise use any written, audio, photographic, video, or other electronic copies or sound or other images of presentation(s), interview(s), chat submission(s), programming, promotional materials, translations or materials that emerge in connection with the Events in written, video, audio, photographic, or any other hard copy or electronic format, including on various websites of, or associated with, the Co-Organisers. It is understood that representatives of various media will attend and will be free to treat communications as on the record and subject to being referenced in their work.

Information regarding the registrant will be processed by the Co-Organisers and their affiliates. Only authorized personnel will have access to the data. Appropriate security and confidentiality measures are in place. The Co-Organisers will share data with other Co-Organisers, who agree to maintain the required data protections and who agree to use the data solely in the planning and communication regarding the Events and related G20 Interfaith Forum events. The data will be deleted within a reasonable period after the purpose of the gathered information has been fulfilled, pursuant to each Co-Organiser's legally prescribed privacy policies.

The registrant has the right to request access to the data that the IF20 or its Co -Organiser(s) hold(s) on him/her, to ask for rectification of the personal data, if they are inaccurate or incomplete, and to object to the processing, as well as to withdraw his/her consent at any time, without cause and at no cost by contacting G20 Interfaith Forum Association at secretariat@g20interfaith.org.

The conditions

By registering, the data subject accepts the conditions by which every Co-Organiser processes data following legislation and policies applicable to each Co-Organiser, as well as privacy policies found on the following sites of said Co-Organisers.

General rules

The Events are public events, open to those who register to participate.

The registrant agrees not to violate any copyright, treaty, or legal restrictions in any country, the use of which would subject IF20, the Co-Organisers or their affiliates to liability.

Registrants agree to abide by reasonable standards or courtesy, civility, and conduct (including any appropriate "streaming" conduct if participating on-line) during the Events.

The registrant waives the right to bring claims against IF20 or any Co-Organiser(s) with respect to any of the matters which he or she has granted permissions or to which he or she has otherwise agreed under these Terms and Conditions.

The IF20 and the Co-Organiser(s) shall have the right to exclude the registrant from the Events if any of the foregoing conditions are violated.
